

## **No PM&DC Official Arrested; Driver Held for Misusing Council's Name: PM&DC Clarifies**

Islamabad 6th November 2025: The Pakistan Medical and Dental Council (PM&DC) on Thursday categorically rejected reports alleging the arrest of a senior PM&DC official in connection with a medical college admission scam, clarifying that no officer or official of the Council has been detained by any law enforcement agency.

A PM&DC spokesperson stated that the individual apprehended by the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) was a driver performing general pool duty at the Council, a low-ranked support staff member with no access to any operational section or decision-making process. "He was neither posted in nor had any role related to admissions, registration, or policy matters. His access was limited strictly to general driving duties," the spokesperson explained.

The Council emphasized that upon receiving complaints about the alleged misconduct, an internal inquiry was immediately initiated at the departmental level. The accused employee was suspended from service for misconduct, and his salary was stopped in accordance with departmental procedures.

The spokesperson further clarified that PM&DC learned about the individual's arrest by the FIA through reports in print and electronic media, which were later confirmed by the Agency. However, the Council reaffirmed its commitment to full cooperation with the FIA and all relevant authorities to ensure that justice is served in accordance with the law.

"PM&DC has a strict zero-tolerance policy towards corruption, fraud, and any misuse of authority," the statement read. "The Council acted swiftly and responsibly upon learning of the matter, ensuring internal accountability and extending full support to the investigating agency."

The PM&DC further reiterated that the Council has no role in the national admission process for medical and dental colleges, as admissions fall purely under the prerogative of the provincial admitting universities.

"It is deeply regrettable that misleading and unverified reports have attempted to tarnish the reputation of this national regulatory body," the spokesperson added. "The PM&DC continues to function with integrity and dedication to uphold merit, transparency, and public trust in medical education and regulation."

The Council regularly advises students and parents to avoid dealing with any unauthorized individuals or intermediaries and to rely solely on official PM&DC communication channels and platforms for admission-related information and guidance.
